We have an exciting opportunity to join our team in the position of Registered Dietitian for a one-year maternity leave coverage. Our eight health centres are located throughout the Northern Ontario region from Sudbury to Sault Ste. Marie along the Highway #17 corridor. Under the supervision of the Health and Wellness Manager, the Registered Dietitian is responsible to provide comprehensive nutritional services, incorporating health, culture and socio-economic status to member First Nations and work in collaboration with Maamwesying North Shore Community Health Services internally and our external partner sites and agencies.

Qualifications:

- University degree in Dietetics or Nutritionist from a recognized University
- Completion of a Dietitians of Canada accredited dietetic internship or Master's degree with demonstrated competencies
- Certified Diabetes Educator certificate an asset
- Member in good standing with the College of Dietitians of Ontario and Dietitians of Canada
- Preferred two years' dietitian experience in a clinical setting
- Must have working knowledge and experience on First Nation mental health issues and Indigenous culture, history and issues.
- Knowledge of community based health care and ability to work in across cultural setting
- Must be able to work flexible hours, including evenings and weekends
- Must possess a valid driver's license and access to a reliable vehicle;

Given the traditional practices of Aboriginal people, from time to time exposure to smoke from the burning of sacred medicines such as tobacco, sweet grass, sage or cedar may occur.
